From the Desk of Father Ed:

Dear Parishioners,

In our Gospel today from St. Mark, Jesus traveled alone with his disciples and taught them. He told them for the second time while on the journey that he was going to be, “*handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death the Son of Man will rise. But they did not understand the saying, and they were afraid to question him.*” Later in their journey Jesus questioned them, “*What were you arguing about on the way?*” And again the disciples remained silent because, “*They had been discussing among themselves on the way who was the greatest.*” The disciples of Jesus failed to understand what he was teaching them about his Passion, Death, and Resurrection. They were afraid to ask him to further explain what it meant. We see how far they were from grasping the meaning of what Jesus was trying to teach them. Rather, they were more concerned about the greatness they were going to receive by traveling with Jesus and being his disciples. They did not comprehend the lesson from the Master that he was explaining the way to achieve true greatness in the eyes of God. They were fixed upon greatness as the world defines it – that is, power, money, and pleasure. Jesus shows us the way to greatness; *He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.*

Greatness is in humbling oneself and serving one another. Jesus came not to be served but to serve. He humbled himself by emptying himself and stepping into his own creation. He humbled himself by allowing himself to be handed over and nailed to the Cross to suffer and die for us. He humbles himself by coming to us in the Eucharist and by waiting for us in the Tabernacle. In reality this is how we measure greatness, not by the standards of the world or our society. We measure greatness through a life of humility and service.

The disciples were *on the way*, that is, they were journeying with the Lord. They were following him from his way up to Jerusalem where he would eventually be put to death. Each one of us is on a journey from our earthly life to our true home which is in the kingdom of heaven. Each of us is called to a life of greatness, to become saints by following Jesus’ example of greatness – to lay down our lives for the sake of the Gospel and to humble ourselves in serving one another.

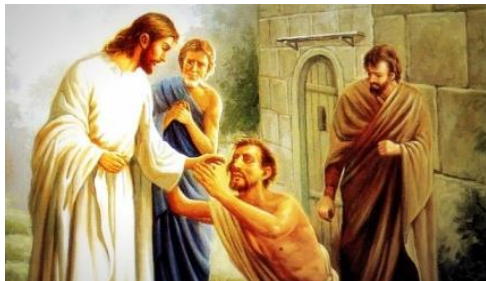
In our Gospel today, Jesus journeyed alone with his disciples so that he could teach them the lesson of what true greatness is in the eyes of God. We too have to spend time alone with the Lord in prayer so that he can teach us the lesson of greatness. There in the school of silence and solitude the Lord teaches us how to be little, that is, how to humble ourselves and to serve one another. As we continue *on the way* towards our heavenly home, let us not be afraid to turn to our Heavenly Father who sent his only Son into the world to save us, and teach us the way to greatness.

Serving Christ Among Us
