## *From the Desk of Father Ed:*

Dear Parishioners,

What a great nation we live in; founded on Christian principles and values. We have a freedom and justice system unlike any other nation in the world. God has truly blessed our land. In our first reading today from the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses reminds the Jewish people who were sojourning in the desert that they too have a great nation, *“For what great nation is there that has gods so close to it as the Lord, our God, is to us whenever we call upon him? Or what great nation has statues and decrees that are as just as this whole law which I am setting before you today?”*

As Catholics we believe that the Church in the new covenant, which was established through the Blood of Jesus by his Passion, Death, and Resurrection, has become the new Israel, the great nation that God has truly blessed. We believe that Jesus is Emmanuel that is, *God is with us*. And we too can make the claim, *“what nation”* or what faith *“has gods so close to it as the Lord, our God, is to us whenever we call upon him?”*

Moses warned the Jewish people in the desert that they must obey all the commandments that God had given them if they wished to remain in God’s favor, if they wanted to remain this great nation whose God was always ready to help whenever called upon and had given them a status of being *truly a wise and intelligent people*. If they obeyed the Lord’s commandments and his statues they would remain God’s holy people and he would lead them into the promise land, the land of Canaan, a land flowing with milk and honey.

As the Church, sons and daughters of the Father of the new covenant, we too must hold fast to the commandments and all the teachings of the Church and stay close to her Sacraments which are the source of Grace. If we do, God will continue to bless his people, and we will witness to the world that we are *truly a wise and intelligent people* and that our God is so close to us and always ready to help whenever we call upon him. And one day he will lead us into the promise land, the kingdom of Heaven, our true home, to be with our Lord forever.

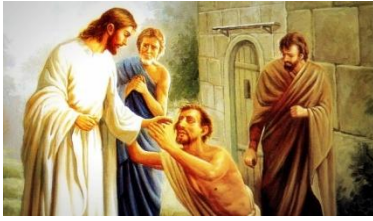

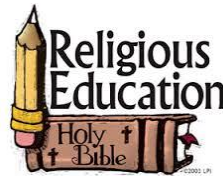
