From the Desk of Father Ed:

Dear Parishioners,

In our Gospel today Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do people say that I am? They said in reply, John the Baptist, Elijah, still one of the prophets." The people did not know who Jesus was. They thought he was a powerful prophet but not the promised messiah that Israel was waiting and hoping for. The messiah that would free them from Roman occupation. The messiah who would be a political king much like King David and restore the kingdom of Israel.

When Jesus asked his disciples, "But who do you say that I am?" It was St. Peter who represents the head of the Church and showed his primacy by answering the Lord, "You are the Christ". When Jesus openly told them that he was going to, "suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days."

Peter rebuked Him because he saw Jesus as the messiah but as a political king like King David. Jesus then rebuked Peter and sharply told him to, "Get behind me Satan" because he was thinking "not as God does, but as human beings do".

Jesus mission was not to come as a political messiah to free Israel from the Roman occupation but to free the world from sin and death.

St. Peter's view of the messiah was not in line with God's plan and in fact was in opposition to what Jesus was sent to accomplish. Ultimately, He was sent by the Father to lay down his life for us - to die on the Cross for us as a sacrifice for our sins; to reveal the Father to us and to make known how much we are loved by our God. St. Peter came to understand this truth of God after the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

Jesus "summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."

St. Peter was thinking in human terms of preserving the life of Jesus and most likely his own. God's plan to save humanity was beyond his imagining; that he would come himself and step into his own creation and become a human person like us in all things but sin so he could suffer and die to save the world from sin and death.

The words that he spoke to St. Peter and his disciples are the same that he speaks to us today. And he asks us the same question, "Who do you say that I am?" do we recognize Jesus as the Son who did the will of the Father by laying down his life on the Cross, the one who suffered and died for love of us. And that he asks us also to do the will of the Father - that is return that love by surrendering our will to the Father.

In our second reading today from St. James he reminds us of the need to be a people of faith but a faith that is evident in the good works that we do. That is how we lay down our lives and take up the cross through a life of faith and virtue; That is how we show our love to the Father by imitating his Son.

Our Lady Queen of Peace, pray for us.



We reserve the Eucharist in the Tabernacle so that we can adore Him and bring Holy Communion to the sick. Christ is truly present in the Eucharist; therefore the Tabernacle should be placed at the center of our Sanctuary, the center of our worship, and the center of our lives. He is the "Source and summit of our lives."


