From the Desk of Father Ed:

Dear Parishioners,

I was reflecting on our parish picnic that took place two weeks ago and the joy and fun that so many families experienced. The children especially enjoyed the four inflatable bounce rides and the numerous games and events that took place that day. Personally, I found it very relaxing to sit around and talk with so many people and to sample many of the foods and desserts that were prepared by our parishioners and semi-professional chefs in the Men's Club. It is easy to see the wisdom of God and his plan for creation at our picnic gathering, that is, God's plan is built upon the family, the fabric of society. We are his sons and daughters and we make up the family of God, his Church.

Our first reading from the book of Genesis, recalls the creation story of man and woman and how they complement one another and are made for each other. *"That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one flesh."* God's plan for man and woman is perfect and clearly revealed to us in Sacred Scripture. God's plan for the family is between a man and woman and they become one through the sacred bond of marriage. The Church elevates this bond between a man and woman to a sacrament. The Sacrament of Marriage parallels the mystery of Christ's love for his Church. Jesus surrendered himself totally on the Cross for love of us his bride (the Church) so that we could be espoused to him now and forever in heaven. Those graces, to share his life and love with his bride, that Jesus won for us on the Cross are poured out to us in the seven sacraments of the Church.

Husbands and wives through the Sacrament of Marriage share in this mystery of Christ's love for his bride the Church. They too are called to surrender to one another in a life of love and service; laying down their lives for love of their spouse. It is in the countless moments of married life that spouses have the opportunity to grow in holiness by developing the virtues that form them into saints and thus helping their spouses gain heaven.

In our Gospel today Jesus answers the Pharisees question, *"Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife"?* Jesus told them that Moses allowed it because of the hardness of their hearts but it was never part of God's plan for marriage. God's plan for marriage from the beginning is between a man and a woman and the bond is forever. We see in our families, parish, and culture how often we fail to achieve God's will for us. All families struggle with the reality of sin in their lives.

Today the Church celebrates Respect Life Sunday. It is a day for us to reflect on God's plan for his creation; that through the Sacrament of Marriage husband and wife in their greatest expression of love for one another in the marital act create with God the most precious gift – the gift of life. All life is precious from the moment of conception to natural death because life comes from God. In the Book of Genesis Man and Woman are told to be fruitful and multiply and have dominion over the earth. God wants husbands and wives to be open to life, not preventing life or to destroy life. Our Father is a merciful and loving God who will forgive us of any sin if we turn to him with true sorrow and show ourselves to the Priest in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. No sin is too great that God cannot forgive. Even *"though your sins be like scarlet they may become white as snow"*. Our God is always there to forgive us and lift us up once again.

What a joy for the Father to see his children having fun at the parish picnic. How much greater his joy when we cooperate with His plan for life; a husband and wife open to children, open to life, loving each other with a sacrificial love and imitating and reflecting the life and love of his Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, the Bridegroom of the Church.
